### **Hand-painted curtains of artist Rex Whistler to undergo urgent restoration**

For the first time, members of the public will be able to witness first-hand the start of urgent conservation work on a pair of Britain's most famous curtains. The curtains in Mottisfont's celebrated Whistler Room, are of great historical significance, as Whistler was painting the mock ermine lining when the Second World War broke out. High up on the wall, out of sight, the artist painted this message: 'I was painting this Ermine curtain when Britain declared war on the Nazi tyrants. Sunday September 3rd.
